Most popular future presentations topics include: UCSD Feeding America Diabetes Project, Lactation Accommodations, CA Farm to School Conference, and recess /physical activity topics. <p>Domain Workgroup Projects</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Partners signed up for the workgroup projects below: • <u>District representative program</u>- currently have 17 district reps that act as liaisons to school district wellness committees regarding policy revisions, recommendations, and other topics discussed at workgroup meetings. Future projects could include providing schools with evidence based wellness policy recommendations on implementation, communication, and evaluation. Districts in need of reps include: Julian High, Mountain Empire, Vallecitos, and Warner Unified. • <u>Healthy Fundraising</u>- identifies and recognizes schools successfully implementing healthy fundraisers. Recognition could include a certificate and/or congratulatory letter at a school board meeting or event, and highlighting them in the COI e-newsletter and community newspaper. • <u>Farm to school</u>- connect the work of the Farm to School Taskforce and the schools domain. Opportunities could include healthy fundraisers, supporting the Garden to Café certification process (through trainings), and connecting schools with education on our food system, Harvest of the Month and Farm to School curriculum. • <u>Partner Education and Collaboration</u>- coordinates presentations for future workgroup meetings and develops opportunities for partners to network and share organizational information. • <u>Physical Activity</u>- still in development. Ideas include support for stronger policy language and implementation of physical education, physical activity and recess/recess before lunch. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •
