After-School 101 Liza Flowers	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> San Diego County Office of Education supports after-school expanded learning programs for school districts and charter schools through ASES, 21stCCLC, and ASSETS (high school). The programs must be student-centered, results-driven, and aligned with the regular school day (not replicated). ASES is the nation’s largest state afterschool program and is funded through Proposition 49; 21stCCLC is funded through No Child Left Behind. In California approximately \$550 million is spent on expanded learning programs, and the time in after-school enrichment amounts to an additional 80 days of student services a year. San Diego has 319 ASES sites in 18 districts and 54 ASSETS sites in 13 districts. Program requirements: available to all students for a minimum of 15 hours a week (until at least 6:00pm), provide educational enrichment programs with a maximum 20 to 1 student to teacher ratio, and offer nutritious snacks. Grantees assess program needs though a continuous quality improvement plan with community stakeholders. Nutrition education is not required and physical activity is available, but not required. CHIP’s food systems team could support programs interested in expanding farm to school to after-school programs. <p>Farm to School Update- Colin Cureton</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 3/4 is the next Farm to School Taskforce meeting, results from the State of Farm to School report will be presented. • 3/5 Olivewood Gardens is hosting a school garden trainings from 8:30am-4pm. • 3/16 and 3/17 Center for Ecoliteracy will have two California Thursdays events: 3/16 “What Local Looks Like” at Waterfront Park, and 3/17 a collective day of action with 13 districts in San Diego County. • Preliminary results from the State of Farm to School survey: in 2014 schools purchased \$3 million from local and regional growers and in 2015 schools purchases more than doubled to \$6-7million (10% of all purchased) • The increase could be a combination of better tracking methods and reporting, and increased purchases.
