



San Diego County Childhood Obesity Initiative Healthcare Domain Minutes June 17, 2016

- I. Welcome and introductions led by Cheri Fidler
- II. OB/GYN Focus Group
 - a. Due to low participating in the focus group, a recommendation was made to conduct phone interviews on a rolling basis. Sue Royappa, an intern with UCSD Center for Community Health may be able to help conduct the interviews.
 - b. Next steps:
 - i. **CHIP staff identify** the cost of phone call recording services for interviews, such as Ready Talk, that allows recordings to be downloaded on the computer.
 - ii. **Nina** adjust pre-survey title to "clinician" focus group
 - iii. **Ask Cheri H. for CNM contact information for interviews.**
 - iv. **Linda**, notify participants of focus group cancellation and the new direction of the project.
 - v. **Linda** notify workgroup when we are ready to move forward with interviews.
- III. [Breastfeeding Measurements in the Outpatient Electronic Health Record Current Practices and Future Possibilities](#)
 - a. Linda provided a brief overview of the report, which aimed to better understand breastfeeding practices in the EHR system and barriers and opportunities for inclusion.
 - b. A few findings from key informant interviews revealed:
 - i. Current state of breastfeeding measurements in EHRs is minimal and that it lacks standardized definitions and measurements.
 - ii. Opportunities include establishing common set of breastfeeding-related definitions, aligning breastfeeding data with quality improvement, and creating a "market" for breastfeeding data.
 - iii. **Cheryl plans to include some of the recommendations in the State of Childhood Obesity Report.**
- IV. WIC BMI and Breastfeeding Data
 - a. Kathleen Merchant with SDSU Research Foundation WIC analyzed breastfeeding data from all five WIC offices throughout San Diego County, which represents 6,856 infants from birth to age five.
 - i. The highest rates for exclusive breastfeeding was 51% for children up to a month old, the rates steadily decreased each month and was down to 22.8% by six months of age.
 - ii. For infants between 24-36 months, 72.2% were at a healthy BMI, 15.8% were overweight, and 12.5% were obese. Between 36-48 months, normal weight decreased to 69.5% and obese increased to 16.9%. By 48-60 months, normal weight was down to 66.9% and obese remained at 16.2%.
- V. 2-1-1 Project Update
 - a. In addition to providing core support to the COI, Kaiser expressed interest in funding a portion of the 2-1-1 pilot project.
 - b. The taskforce met and is in the process of scaling the project down from 300 to 150 participants.
